The City contractor's work on Lake Shore Boulevard West continues. In order to safely remove and replace the track allowance on a section of the street, the intersection of **Lake Shore Blvd West at Brookers Lane will be partially closed for track replacement.**



Weather permitting this work will take place from 9:00 AM Friday November 17 to 6:00 A.M. Monday, November 20, 2017.

Further updates regarding the remaining work will be delivered in the coming weeks.

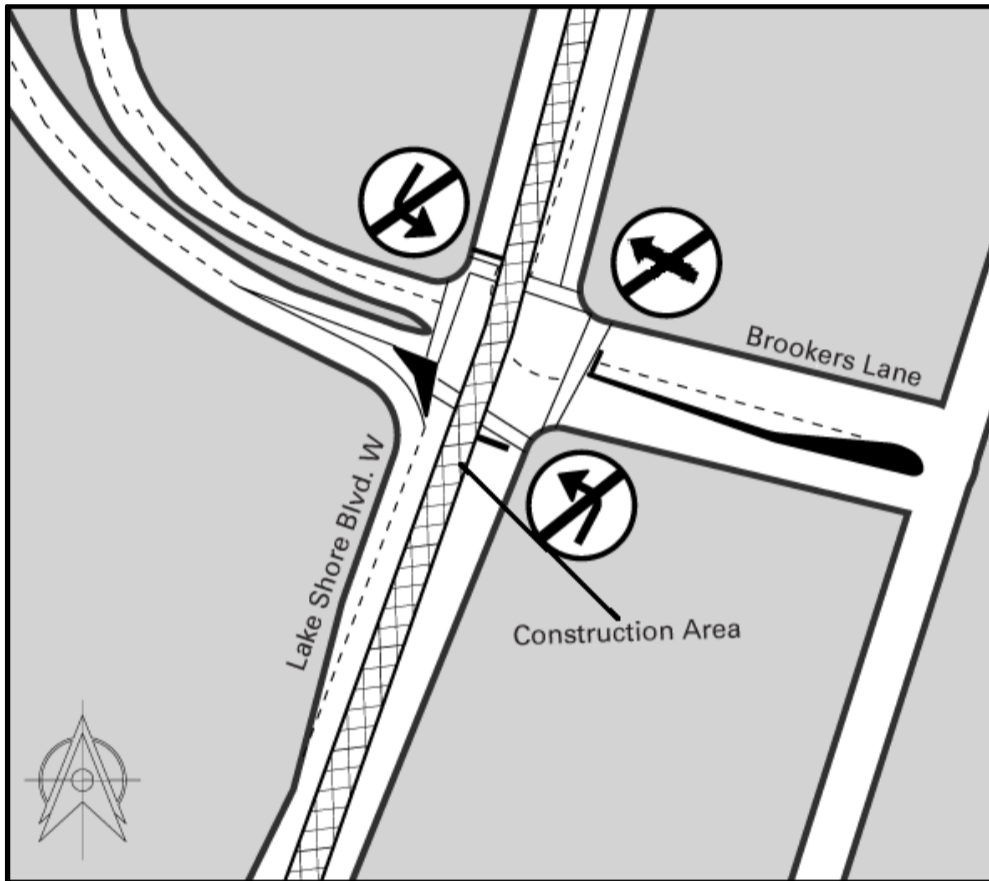
WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION


	<p>This intersection work will take place 24/7.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The loudest portion of work is on the first day when breaking and removing concrete. This type of work will stop at 11:00 p.m. The work hours will be split between the City's contractor and TTC staff working on the track replacement. Other work will take place over night. The overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving new rail into position, rail installation and rail welding / grinding and concrete pouring/curing. Afterhours work by TTC is required to support the daytime construction and complete work more efficiently. <p>Regular work hours on this project will resume on November 20.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Eastbound and westbound traffic on Lake Shore Boulevard West will be maintained in the curb lanes through the intersection. Northbound traffic on Brookers Lane can only turn right and will be required to make a U turn to access the eastbound Gardiner ramp. Traffic coming off the westbound ramp can only turn right and will be required to make a U turn at the next lights to access Brookers Lane Eastbound traffic on Lake Shore cannot make a left turn to access the Gardiner ramp and will be required to make a U turn at the next traffic lights <p><i>Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</i></p>
	<p>TTC Service:</p> <p>501/301 Queen buses on Lake Shore Blvd W will be maintained through the intersection /work zone, while other bus routes may need to be diverted around the work zone.</p> <p>Updated service information will be issued by TTC in a separate notice, as required.</p> <p>TTC Route/Schedules/Fares: 416-393-4636 or visit ttc.ca.</p>
	<p>Pedestrian Access:</p> <p>No pedestrian crossing will be maintained at the intersection of Brookers Lane and Lake Shore Blvd west. Pedestrians must walk to Park Lawn Road to cross Lake Shore Blvd West.</p>



	<p>Accommodation: Residents that require accommodation must contact the Project Information Line to arrange for access during construction.</p>
	<p>Businesses will be open throughout construction. All are welcome to dine and shop locally.</p>
